A Guide to Funerals and Memorial Services 2020

This leaflet should help you decide what might be best for you as you think about planning a service at St. Marylebone Parish Church.

Can you arrange a funeral or memorial service here?

Yes, you can.

We are very happy to meet with you to discuss your specific requirements.

Date & Time

Personally, or through your Funeral Director, please make an appointment to meet the Rector or one of the other clergy on the team. Discuss what date and time you would like the service to take place. The longer notice we have the easier it is to meet your requirements.

How much will it cost?

Funeral/Memorial Service invoices will, usually, be sent to the Funeral Director, unless we are informed otherwise.

Music

Music at a Funeral or Memorial Service can be very important. We have a very fine musical tradition here at St Marylebone with a fine choir of professional classical musicians.

We will be happy to talk with you about your choice of music, and recommend organ and choir pieces suitable to the occasion. For the

recommended list of Organ Music and Choral items, please see the list appended to this document. Please do not feel limited by this list of suggestions however.

Please note that recorded music cannot be played at Funerals or Memorial services at St Marylebone.

A **'Standard' Funeral Service** at St Marylebone (which includes the organ, an organist, ten professional singers, Director of Music, Fees, and up to 100 printed Orders of Service is approximately £2,984.00. We can provide additional solo instrumentalist (cello, violin, etc.), if required at an additional cost

A **'Standard' Memorial Service** at St Marylebone (which includes the organ, an organist, ten professional singers, Director of Music, Fees, and up to 100 printed Orders of Service is approximately £3,225.00. We can provide additional solo instrumentalist (cello, violin, etc.), if required at an additional cost

Catering

You can hold a reception following a Funeral or Memorial Service here at St Marylebone. Up to 125 guests can be accommodated in the Crypt Hall. A larger number can be accommodated by staying in the main worship space of the parish church. St Marylebone works with Hubbub caterers (although you may provide your own catering). Catering and Room Hire is an extra charge.

Readings

Every Funeral or Memorial service will include at least one reading from Holy Scripture. You may find this website helpful. It lists suitable Bible passages:

The Funeral Service

You have a choice from two different funeral services. One uses contemporary language (you, yours), the other uses more traditional

language (thee, thou). The Rector will discuss the options with you.

Order of Service

On the day of the Funeral or Memorial Service the congregation will need to follow the service in a printed Order of Service booklet. This booklet will include within it the words of the hymns, the names and words of the musical items, the reading(s) etc. We will undertake the printing of up to 100 good quality copies within the quoted price. Extra copies or copies with extra pages (such as photographs, etc.) will be charged at cost. The Orders of Service are printed professionally.

Flowers

We are very happy for you to have flowers in St Marylebone, and these can be ordered by the parish church at an extra cost. However, you do not have to purchase extra flowers.

Recording

We are very happy for this to take place within certain parameters, however, you should note that there will be an additional cost for this.

Funerals and Memorial Services: the choices you need to make

Interment of Cremated Remains

St. Marylebone has a Columbarium in the Crypt where cremated remains can be safely and appropriately deposited. If you would like to make use of this facility, please discuss the options with the clergy. A one-off fee of £500.00 is charged for this.

Retiring Collection

Many families like to take a collection in aid of the parish church or a charity supported by the person who has died. The parish church is happy to source Gift Aid envelopes and process the collection on your behalf.

Conclusion

All of this can sound a little overwhelming at first, but with time and thoughtful planning you will end up with a Funeral or Memorial Service which will be able to give comfort to family member, friends and colleagues of the deceased.

Hymns

Singing hymns binds a congregation together and helps to express some of our deepest emotions which are often hard to put into our own words.

We recommend that you have 3 hymns. The clergy will be happy to discuss this choice with you, but here are some you might like to consider:

- *The Lord's my shepherd*
- *Abide with me, fast falls the eventide*
- *The day thou gavest, Lord, is ended*
- *All my hope on God is founded*
- *All people that on earth do dwell*
- *And did those feet in ancient time ('Jerusalem')*
- *Be thou my vision, O Lord of my heart*
- *Dear Lord and Father of Mankind*

- *Guide me, O thou great Redeemer*
- *Immortal, invisible, God only wise*
- *King of glory, King of peace*
- *Love Divine, all loves excelling*
- *Now thank we all our God*
- *O worship the King, all glorious above*
- *Praise to the Lord, the almighty, the King of Creation*
- *Praise, my soul, the King of heaven*
- *The King of Love my shepherd is*
- *Jerusalem*
