YOUNG CHURCH gathers after the Collect at the foot of the choir steps before proceeding to the Crypt for their teaching; they re-join the congregation for Communion. Parents with babies and younger children may use the Browning Room, where a speaker relays the service. Children must be accompanied to or from the Browning Room and must never be left unattended.

Collect of the Week:

Almighty Father, who hast given thine only Son to die for our sins and to rise again for our justification: grant us so to put away the leaven of malice and wickedness that we may alway serve thee in pureness of living and truth; through the merits of Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

Post Communion Prayer:

Lord God our Father, who through our Saviour Jesus Christ hast assured us of eternal life and in baptism made us one with him: deliver us from the death of sin and raise us to new life in thy love, in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. **Amen**

MUSIC NOTES

Orlando de Lassus was born in Mons (Hainaut) in 1532 and died in Munich in 1594. He was one of the most gifted and prolific composers of his time, and although little is known about his early life, legend has it that he was three times abducted because of the beauty of his voice. It was during his time as *maestro di capella* in Munich that Lassus wrote much of his liturgical music. His *Missa Surrexit pastor bonus* is scored for 5 voices, and is a parody mass, based on Lassus's motet of the same name.

Charles Villiers Stanford (1852 - 1924) was a Professor of Music at Cambridge University, as well as at the Royal College of Music. An influential teacher, many of his students number amongst the Twentieth Century's most important British composers. The Eastertide anthem *Ye choirs of New Jerusalem* was written in 1910. The text is a translation of a hymn written by St Fulbert of Chartres, now well-known as H J Gauntlett's hymn tune 'St Fulbert'. Stanford's contrasts two musical ideas; the first, a buoyant triple meter in the major mode ('Ye choirs of New Jerusalem'), the second in duple meter and in the minor ('Devouring depths of hell their prey').

Jean Lhéritier (c. 1480—c. 1552) was born in Northern France, and spent about 10 years working in Rome before returning to Avignon as Chapelmaster in 1530. His music is found in many sources, which indicates the high regard in which it was held.

In this first session, artist, illustrator and designer, Katyuli Lloyd will be giving a talk on illustrating Virginia Woolf's novel 'Flush', the biography of Elizabeth Barrett Browning's cocker spaniel. The richly illustrated edition features some 30 full page colour and black and white illustrations by Katyuli which were short-listed for the V&A Illustration Awards.

Music for the Moment: The next concert by students of the Royal Academy of Music will take place on **Friday 3rd May** at St Marylebone Parish Church with a performance by Megumi Tanimura (violin). Refreshments will be served from 2.30pm by students from the St Marylebone CE School and the concert will start at 3pm. These free concerts are devised with those living with dementia and their carers in mind but all are welcome.

The 2019 Organ Recital Series continues at the parish church on **Sunday 5th May at 4pm** with a recital by Benjamin Scott (St Augustine's Abbey, Ramsgate). Admission is free with a retiring collection.

Back the Back Concert: A musical celebration of the countryside here at the Parish Church on Saturday **22nd June at 6pm**. The Firth Singers and guest choirs present an eclectic choral celebration. This is a launch concert for the 'Back the Back Walk' (beginning 30th June) which is a walk of the full 268 miles of the Pennine Way or 'Backbone of Britain' to raise awareness of Scoliosis, the abnormal curvature of the spine.
